In the Community Garden

We planted a southernwood hedge and moved the red sage. We also emptied, moved and refilled one of the corrugated round beds, and added soil and compost to another, and the asparagus bed.

On the construction front, progress has been made on the solar installation.

The next lot of compost is ready and the compost bays and bins are filled again.

A thorough clean up of the garden has been completed, mulch spread on paths and the burnt poker sign revamped and sealed.

Tip of the Week: Backyard bush tucker Murrong or yam daisy



Grow: In a pot that catches at least half a day of sunlight. Plant April to September, water every other day in summer and once a week in winter. Harvest in November.

Eat: Raw or roasted, ideal with vegetable salads or a roast.

Tastes: Starchy, sweet, earthy, like coconut and parsnip.
