In 2025 the Junior School (Prep to year 06) will introduce Auslan sign language classes to engage and promote diversity for our young learners. In 2024, through teacher innovation and your financial support, we provided new exciting student programs such as the *Year 10 EnlighTEN Program* which allows students to select from a diverse set of electives in each key learning area. This has proven to be very successful, and we are exploring a similar opportunity for Year 9 through the new *Nine-finity Program*. Other initiatives include:

- enhanced digital learning opportunities;
- additional VCE subject offerings;
- the completion of new seating, light & sound in the Theatre and Hall;
- continuous improvement of our College communication systems;
- new outdoor and indoor student seating;
- continual refurbishment of classrooms;
- new VCE Study Centre in 2025;
- student lunchtime activities sports, dance and other clubs and more.

### **Payment Methods**

Financial payment or contribution by families is critical to maintaining the quality of education, student services and school environment.

### Option 1 – Pay in Full

Curriculum and Other Contributions and Extra-Curricular payments can be made in full by 01 January 2025.

#### Option 2 – Payment Plan

Curriculum and Other Contributions and Extra-Curricular payments have been dispersed over the year, with the first instalment date as of **01 January 2025**.

### **Option 3 – Modified Payment Plan**

A modified payment plan can be set up for weekly, fortnightly or other. Families with more than one student may request to set up only one plan instead of multiple plans. Please contact Reception.

### Refunds

Parent/carer requests for refunds are subject to the College discretion and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the College deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

Macleod College refund policy does not allow for cash refunds. All approved refunds will be credited to the family account to be used for any future expenses.

# ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

## FREE INSTRUCTION

 Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.

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Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

## PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

## Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

## Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

## Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

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Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



# FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot
  pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



# SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
