Spaces for use outside of class time

There are many spaces that students have access to outside of class times

- All students can enter the <u>Impact Centre after 8:45am, during recess, lunchtime or after school</u> to see Mrs Cochrane, Mrs Karalis or Ms Wan
- All students can enter the <u>classroom (D12) after 8:45am</u> to prepare for the day of classes
- During recess and lunchtime, all students can stay indoors in the Library or Canteen. Alternatively, students can go to any other area of the school grounds and immerse themselves within the college community

I hope you all can enjoy every day you are here in Australia, and be serious in learning English because communication is key to success.


